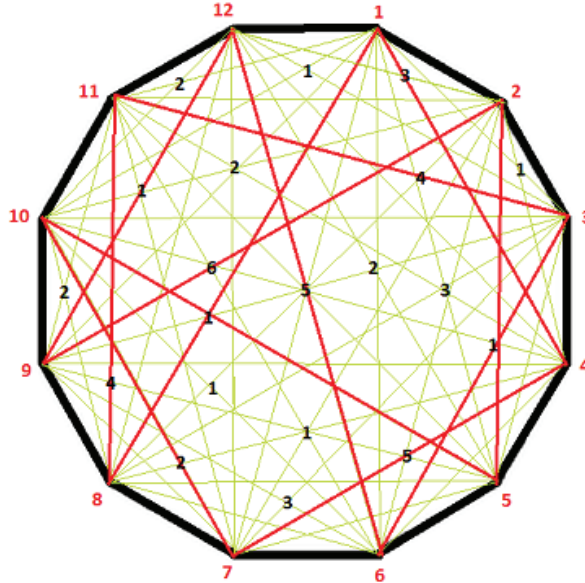


Solution: *Capsize*

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The puzzle was set up as twelve pairs of images arranged in a circular fashion. Inside the circle, gold “coins” with a number on top of them.



- 1 SCAR, DATE
- 2 ICE, BRIE
- 3 LOCK, BEG
- 4 CITY, PI
- 5 ON, OFF
- 6 WAR, ROW
- 7 SEA, RATING
- 8 NATIONS, MAN
- 9 LEG, FLY
- 10 HER, SON
- 11 INNINGS, CAR
- 12 FUR, ION

These words can be paired to make another word. These words, much like capsize, are “fake compound words” – they are made up of two words, but have nothing to do with either word. Along the line of sight between the two halves of the words there is a coin that provides an index into the word.

These words actually form a full circuit through all 12 locations. This loop started with the word BEGINNINGS, which hopefully clues where to begin. Reading the indexed letters gives the clue phrase “inmate hollow”. These are synonyms that can form another “fake compound word” which is the answer: CONCAVITY.
