

Powderhouse The Fletcher-Maynard Marathon

These competitors are **counting** on their **pictures** along the sidewalk of fame to make sure their **names** go down in history! You'll be able to follow in the **footsteps** of **The Fastest Animals of Fletcher-Maynard Academy**.

This is a location puzzle; you may not be able to solve this if you move on to another location. You will not need to travel outside a 1-block radius of Greene-Rose Heritage Park.

- 1. No pair of animals with adjacent fence panels placed immediately next to each other in the race.
- 2. Sawyer, Siouxsie, and Sophie all had at least two other animals between them in the race order.
- 3. The elephant placed fifth, and Sawyer came in last. The squirrel did not place seventh.
- 4. The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Middlesex County and The Duck of Standard Attractiveness are a frog and a duck, respectively. The Diligent Feller of Birches has an unusual tail.
- 5. Cameron and Sawyer hatched from eggs.
- 6. Amelia, the rabbit, placed after the beaver but before the panda.
- 7. Sophie placed immediately after Delphia, and was immediately followed by the duck.
- 8. The Doggedly Watchful Listener takes after their uncle Horton, and The Nemesis of Vacuum Cleaners Everywhere was inspired by their cousin Ulysses. (Neither Ulysses nor Horton raced.)
- 9. Jameson's favorite food can be found hidden in his epithet.
- 10. The first three winners were all herbivores and crossed the finish line in order from largest to smallest.
- 11. The Great Bamboozler, The Looming Swamp Trekker, and The Nemesis of Vacuum Cleaners Everywhere all have seven letters in their names.
- 12. No animal's placement in the race was the same as the number of letters in their type of animal.
- 13. The rabbit and the beaver were adjacent to each other in the race results, in some order.
- 14. Mathias is heavier than Amelia, Jameson and Delphia together.
- 15. The Real Not Velveteen is not the moose.
- 16. The four female animals all placed together in a row, and none placed first.
