First, identify the two characteristics that go with each word:

ALTERNATES – Y & g (rule W)

AUTOMATA – J & U (Mata Hari)

DOMAINS – G (Madison) & T (remains)

EDUCATION – A & Z (ducat)

EIGHTH – L & X

GRAMMARIAN – C & O (margin)

HEADACHE – B & V

MAINLAND – D & K

MEGACHIROPTERAN – R (cinematographer) & S (chi)

PEDAGOGICALLY – F & I

REPERTOIRE – H & Q

SLANDER – E & M

TERRA – N (green) & a

UBIQUITOUS – P & b

UNDERSTUDY – d & z

VERISIMILITUDE – W & e

If you draw lines on the castle connecting the label letters for each of these pairs of blocks, one line will pass through each of the numbers. Indexing into the word representing that pair of characteristics by the number gives a letter:

hEadache

doMains

repertOire

Terra

verlsimilitude

ubiquitOus

alterNates

Reading across the two rows of numbers, this gives the answer word **EMOTION**.
